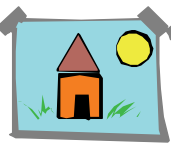
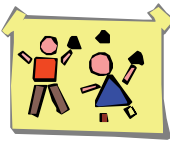
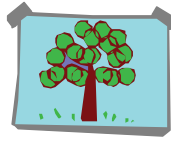

ST. ANN SCHOOL DRESS CODE 2010-2011 School Year

St. Ann School recognizes the importance of distinguishing education from recreation. Modesty requires that a person's attire does not draw inappropriate attention to their bodies.

Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God, and that you are not your own? For you have been purchased at a price. Therefore, glorify God in your body.

(1 Corinthians 6:19-20)

Every individual is created by God with their own unique gifts. *"I praise you, so wonderfully you made me; wonderful are your works!" Psalm 139:14* Apparel decisions must be reflective of this principle. A dress code removes social implications of dress, and stresses the important sense that we are all part of the same Catholic community. Therefore, all students at St. Ann Catholic School will abide by the following dress code, and compliance with the dress code is the responsibility of both the students and parents.

Clothing Item	Grades K-7
Slacks	Solid colors: brown, tan, navy, black and gray
Shorts/Skirts/Skorts/Capris Jumpers/Dresses	Solid colors: brown, tan, navy, black and gray No more than 2" above the knee
Shirts	Polo or collared button dress shirt. Solid colors, plaids, stripes and appropriate floral prints. Shirts can be long or short sleeve and should be tucked in.
Sweaters	Solid colors, plaids, stripes; cardigan, crew neck, v-neck, and zip up sweaters are allowed. Must be waist/hip length and worn with collared shirt or turtleneck. Vests are also allowed.
Socks	Socks are to be worn at all times and of solid color.
Shoes	Shoes can be casual, athletic or dress, but must be closed toe. Crocs and backless shoes are not permitted.
Belts (optional)	Solid colors: brown, tan, navy, black and gray.

- Determinations of appropriateness are made at the discretion of the administration and/or designee.
- No images or graphics allowed. Approved St. Ann logo/name allowed.
- Mass days solid colors only.
- If a student/family has difficulty acquiring proper clothing, the school office can assist.
- Clothing and jewelry items should not pose a safety concern.
- Denim and knit pants, frayed, ripped, excessively tight and loose fit clothing items, as well as, hooded shirts are not permitted.
